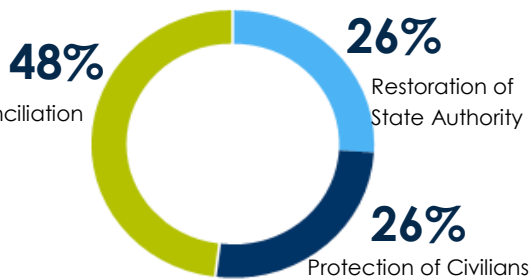
Projects to improve the quality of life of local populations and strengthen collaboration with Central African authorities.

OBJECTIVES

Quick Impact Projects (QIPs) aim to build confidence in the mission, the mandate, the peace and reconciliation process, and serve communities. They contribute to the strengthening of institution, ultimately allowing:

- The progressive restoration of state authority
- Improved delivery of basic social services
- Reconciliation and POC initiatives

IMPLEMENTATION CHALLENGES AND CONSTRAINTS

The number of QIPs is increasing each year despite multiple constraints present in the country:

- Poor road conditions throughout the country
- The lack of transportation infrastructure
- The feeble capacity of implementing partners
- The security situation

QIPs act as a catalyst to attract technical and financial partners. The aim to foster national ownership and engage communities in enacting change.



QIPs BUDGET and IMPLEMENTING PARTNERS

A total budget of \$3 million a year, with a \$50,000 maximum allocation per project. Implemented by 38 NGOs and national associations and 6 International Organizations.

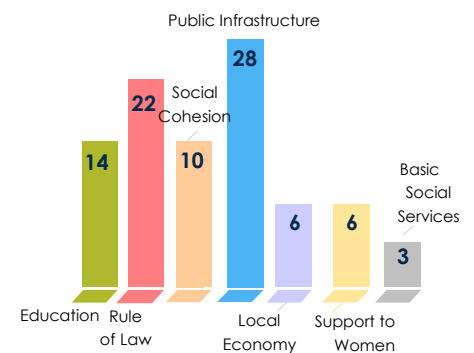
STRATEGY 2018-2019

About 28% of the QIPs budget is allocated to the rehabilitation of public structures.



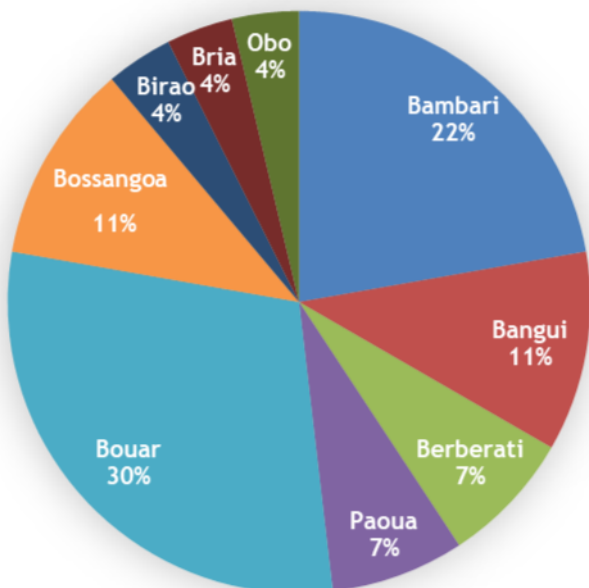
Support to the Progressive Restoration of State Authority

QIPs help improve the delivery of public services and provide a decent working environment for civil servants and state representatives.

They have also contributed to the implementation of Pillar II of the National Recovery and Peacebuilding Plan (RCPA): « renovate the social contract between the state and the population»

Their multi-sectoral approach (security, social services, public finance, etc.) contributes to the implementation of the national RESA strategy.

2017-18 Implementation of RESA projects per field office

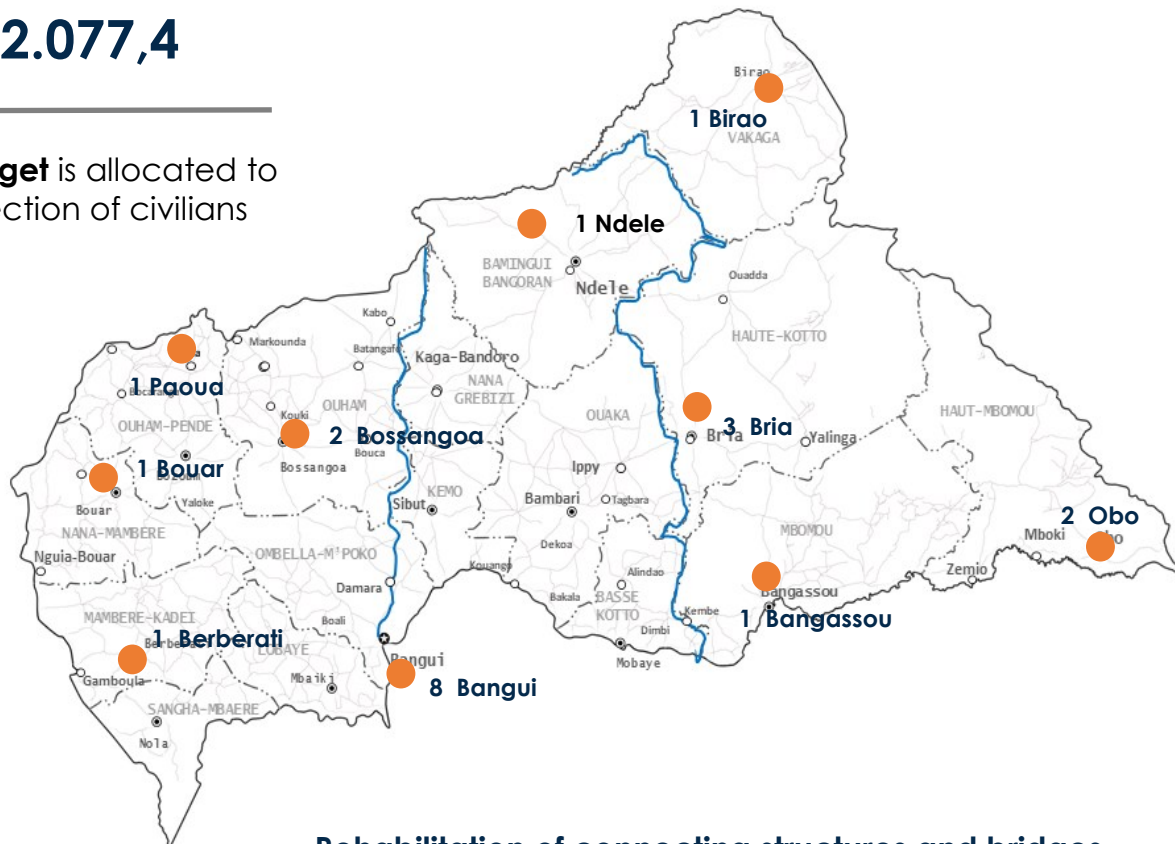

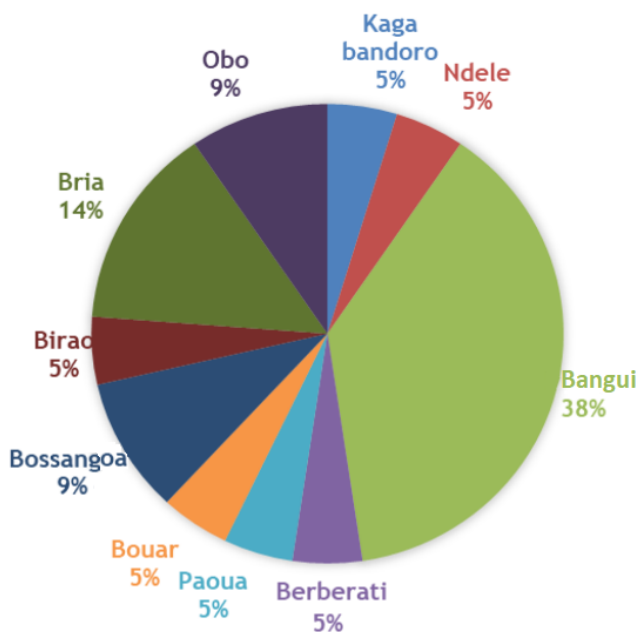
About 26% of the QIPs budget is allocated to projects tied to the protection of civilians

Rehabilitation of connecting structures and bridges to enhance the mobility of ISF and the MINUSCA force to better protect civilians

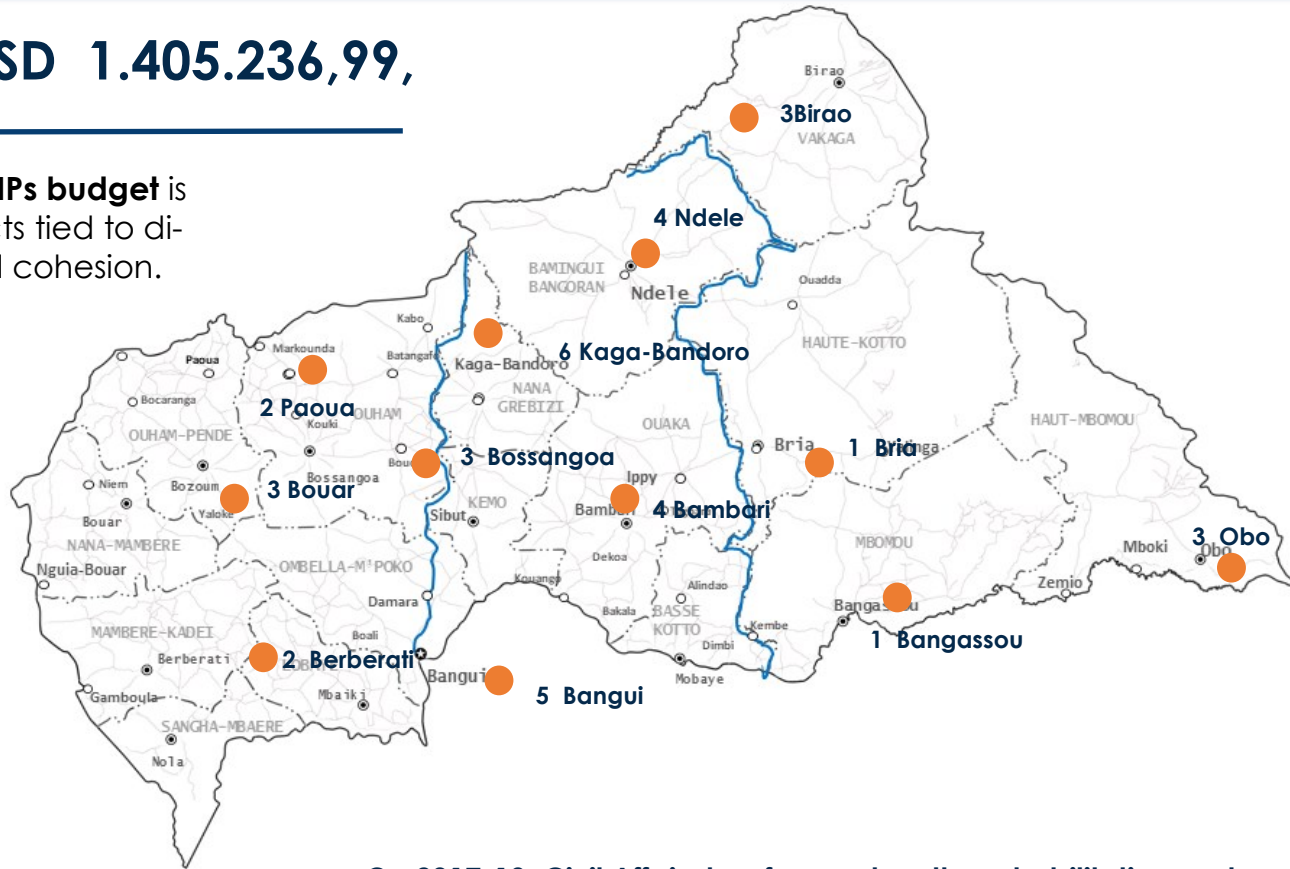
Distribution of POC QIPs per field office
