During her 34 -years career of working with the United Nations, she has gathered a solid and practical experience of all the facets of the UN-led programs and multidimensional activities, all performed in conflict and post-conflict situations. She worked close in coordination with the missions in her area of responsibility (MONUSCO, UNOCI, MINUSTAH, UNIFIL, UNMISS, UNPOS, BINUCA / MINUSCA and UNIOGBIS) and her experience also includes two years with UNDP BCPR at UNHQ as Senior DDR and SSR Advisor.

As chief of unit, head of programs, sub-regional advisor, senior advisor, and project coordinator in Africa (DRC, Ivory Coast, Sudan, Guinea Bissau, Somalia, Libya), in Middle East (Lebanon and Yemen) and in Haiti, she has worked on the ground in close coordination with all the UN agencies involved, as well as with the many political stakeholders at senior level, including key national authorities at the ministerial level, senior officials and dedicated civilian and uniformed experts deployed with peacekeeping missions and political offices.
